
<u>Uniform</u>

- No fake tans, false nails or make-up




Reading

- Ask questions about the book
- Note and sign the reading diary
- Story time




Reading

- Reading books will be changed 3 times per week in Year 2.
- Mondays/Wednesdays/Fridays –
 please make sure that your child
 brings in their book bag on these
 days.
- Monday and Wednesday are books to be shared together and Friday will be their phonics reading book/coloured book band book.



Phonics Screening

- Children who did not pass their phonics screening check in Year 1 will resit the check near the end of Year 2.
- They will do their Phonics Screening Check at the same time as Year 1 in the Summer with class teacher.
- Daily phonics to prepare children.



Phonics Screening

The test contains 40 words.

Each child will sit one to one and read each word aloud to a teacher.

The test will take approximately 10 minutes per child; although all children are different and will complete the check at their own pace.

The list of words the children read is a combination of 20 real words and 20 pseudo words (nonsense words).

Times Tables

- Introducing Times Tables in Year 2
- Knowing your tables makes lots of areas of maths so much easier
- By the end of Y2 all the children should know 2's, 5's and 10's
- Times tables practice will continue all year



Homework

 Will be sent out to enhance and consolidate children's learning

<u>PE</u>

Pupil Premium Funding

- School receives £1445 for every child entitled to free school meals.
- This funding provides additional staff, trips and resources to support these children in school.
- Even if your child is on packed lunches or is in Y1 & Y2 and you think your child may be eligible, please let the office know and they will support you in applying.

Free School Meals

You can apply for free school meals if you or your child receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of £16,190 or less
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit In England, if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income
 must be less than £7400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get). If your
 child is currently eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until they finish the
 phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2022.
