painting


Geography: biomes

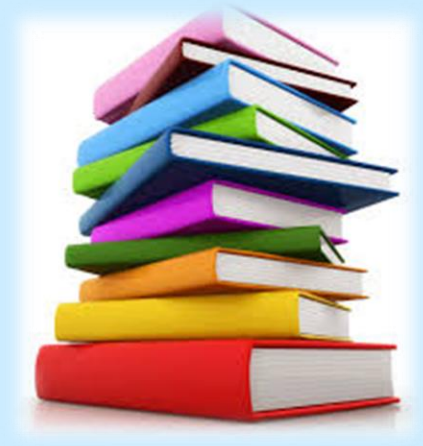

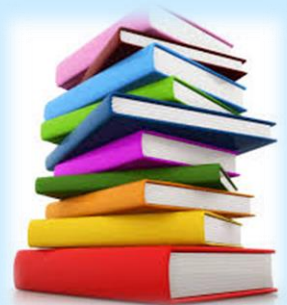
Reading

 - Guided reading in ability groups



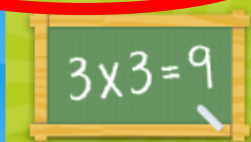
maths

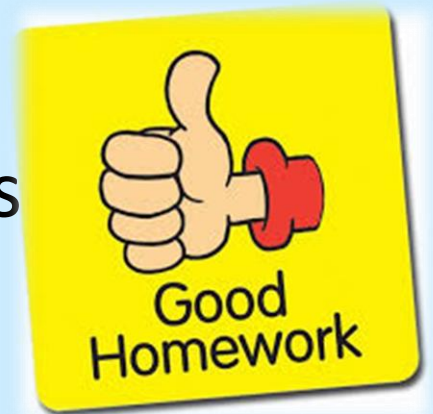
Uniform

- Milk – letter from the office to request milk (there is a charge unless your child is on FSM)



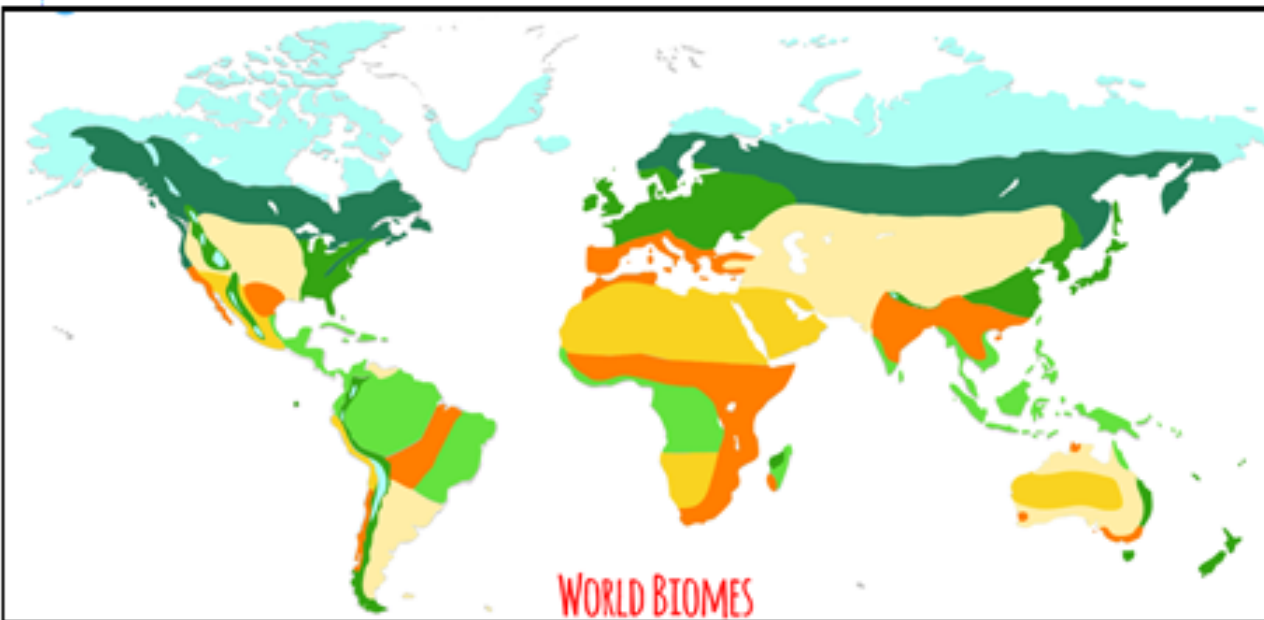
Pupil Premium Funding

K.O. Y3 Biomes

A large area with similar animals and plants.



 rainforest	 boreal/taiga forest	 grassland	 desert
 temperate/deciduous forest	 savannah	 tundra	 ice

Polar regions	Located at the northern and southern most points on earth. The North Pole is ice. The South Pole is land.
Deserts	An area with little or no vegetation because of low rainfall.
Boreal Forests	Found in sub polar regions. A large wooded area with lots of evergreen plants. Evergreen trees have modified leaves to hold moisture.
Deciduous Forest	Found in temperate zones. A large wooded area with trees that lose their leaves in autumn.
Tropical Rainforest	Hot and wet. Found near the equator. The Amazon is the world's largest rainforest.
Temperate Grassland	Found in the Northern Hemisphere between the deserts and the boreal forests.
Tropical Grassland	Often called Savannah. Found between tropical rainforests and deserts.
Aquatic	The aquatic biome includes fresh-water and salt water regions. It is the largest biome.

Seasons	Divisions of the year. Decided by earth's position to the sun.	Climate	Long term weather conditions of an area.
Continent	One of earth's 7 land masses.	Equator	An imaginary circle around the earth that divides the northern and southern hemispheres.
